





Concept Note | Strengthening the Role of the African Private Sector in Disaster Risk Management

Event Overview

While many low- and middle-income countries have already developed national strategies for disaster risk reduction, challenges remain when it comes to implementing these strategies and ensuring that they reflect the voices of different actors, including the private sector.

This year's International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction on October 13th will highlight Target (f) of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, focusing on the importance of international cooperation and partnerships.

This is an opportunity to reaffirm the role of the private sector in reducing the impacts of human-induced and natural hazards in disaster-prone countries.

As the pandemic, extreme weather events, and other natural and human-induced hazards have shown the need for multistakeholder partnerships in disaster risk reduction, the UNDP-OCHA Connecting Business initiative (CBi) and UNDRR ARISE Africa will hold a joint webinar on **"Strengthening the Role of the African Private Sector in Disaster Management"** to highlight good practices, as well as challenges, in public-private partnerships on achieving progress in the implementation of national strategies on disaster risk reduction, preparedness, response and recovery.
